ProLife Facts: On 26 June Parliament voted for the End of Life Choice Bill, which proposes to legalise euthanasia and assisted suicide, to pass its Second Reading. The margin of 70 votes to 50 was smaller than that of the First Reading vote (76 – 44) and included nine MPs who changed their vote from yes to no. MPs from NZ First and the Greens were required to vote for the Bill as parties. Of the 102 MPs who were allowed to vote according to their personal views. 50 voted against the Bill. Many of those who voted for the Bill actually voted for Parliament to have more debate - not for the Bill as it stands. They expressed concerns about the risk that people may request a death by lethal drugs because they were victims of abuse or coercion and pointed out that the Bill lacks adequate safeguards. On Wednesday 31 July MPs will start to debate proposed amendments at the Committee of the House stage.
