ASSISTANT PARISH PRIEST PERSONAL REPORT AND REFLECTION ABOUT HOLY CROSS PARISH

Pope Francis, in opening the synod process some years ago, emphasised that all the faithful of God in every unit of the community (archdiocese, diocese, parish, station/substation, family) should continuously develop and increase their sense of “walking together.” “Walk together” means encouraging each other, prioritising mutual dialogue, together mitigating and resolving the problems, together discussing any issues of the parish, and together finding solutions.

AGM is the actualisation of Synodality to walk together and listen to each other as a parish. Let us realise that our parish is one of the largest parishes in the Diocese of Auckland. It is a very multi-ethnic, multi-national and diverse background. AGM this year should make us stronger in unity, whanaungatanga, and a sense of belonging to our parish. As we are able to talk to each other, we have to be able to walk together, listen to each other and support each other. We are called to make our parish a parish of joy, where each person (priest, deacon, parishioner) finds the joyful heart when we celebrate our faith together in Jesus Christ. We have had experience some time ago that we were overburdened by some issues: reputation, accountability, credibility, integrity, and pride that we’ve built looks like gone away. We don’t want the same thing to happen again. We have to progress the spirit of Synodality in our parish.

Holy Cross has all the capacity to move forward better and faster. We also never doubt about the human resources of this parish (dedication, integrity, commitment, cooperation, concern, etc). Let us make our parish a parish of joy. We are joyful because we are always available to give. But giving is not only about material giving. It is also about the spirit of service, volunteering to coordinate Mass, to welcome people, to offer hospitality, to teach the faith, and to care for those in need. Saint Francis said, “Let us do once again, because till today we are still doing a very few”.

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL

Kia Ora and welcome, everyone.

This report outlines the progress, challenges, developments, and growth of our Parish since the last AGM.

The Parish has experienced rapid growth, with the number of parishioners continuing to increase. This reflects not only the multicultural nature of our community—welcoming people from many different backgrounds—but also the active participation of both adults and children. We are seeing steady growth and positive development and look forward to continued progress in the near future.

Parish Hall

In October last year, the Auckland Diocese proposed that our Parish Hall be used by Holy Cross School as temporary classrooms for 16 months, while the school undergoes redevelopment of two new buildings.

This proposal was discussed at Parish Council meetings, and it was agreed that parishioners should have a say. A survey was conducted after all Masses to ask whether the community supported the school's temporary use of the hall. The Parish Council also considered parishioners' concerns, especially given that the hall had been used regularly by various groups, and that we had been fundraising for two years to repair and maintain the hall after storm damage.

Following the survey, the majority supported the proposal, and the hall has been in use by the school since 1st February 2025.

There is financial compensation from the Diocese for the use of the hall, which the Finance Committee will address in their report.

Issues

The main issue raised since last year has been car parking—especially during the 9:00am and 10:30am Masses. Many people arrive early for the 10:30am Mass, which results in cars blocking the exits for those leaving after the 9:00am Mass. Despite having car park wardens assisting, the problem persists. Some people have even parked in our neighbour's car park, or double-parked, which has led to warnings about potential fines from the council for illegal parking.

This has raised serious health and safety concerns. The issue has been discussed at Parish Council meetings, and it was agreed that the Parish Priest would consult with the Bishop about whether a change in Mass times might help alleviate the parking congestion.

A survey was conducted focusing on the 9:00am and 10:30am Masses, offering options to either move the 9:00am Mass to 8:30am or shift the 10:30am Mass to 11:00am. The majority of parishioners from both Masses voted to move the 10:30am Mass to an 11:00am start.

Further discussions on this are currently on hold until we receive guidance from the Bishop.

Clergy and Vocations

This year, there have been some changes in our clergy, with several priests being reassigned to other parishes.

A special highlight this year is the commissioning of one of our own parishioners, Deacon Adolf Goldwyn—a proud and joyous milestone for our community.

Our Parish Priest will provide more details on these changes in his report.

Parish Events and Celebrations

Throughout the year, we've continued to celebrate and grow together as a Parish. Various groups— Caring Committees, prayer groups, and cultural communities—have actively supported and served the Parish in many ways.

Just last Sunday, we celebrated our Parish Feast Day, with a beautiful lunch provided after the 10:30am Mass.

Our Parish holds five Masses every Sunday and all those Masses are well supported and well attended. Our Parish is flourishing and very much alive. The body and blood of Christ on Sunday 22nd June. We started with the procession of the Blessed Sacrament at 10.30am around the school ground and back to church. Big number of Parishioners joined the procession.

- Bro. Matthew's renewal of vows went off well. It was a great celebration and again Mass was well attended.

Auckland Fiji Catholic Community

Introduction

This report outlines the key events and activities of the Fijian Catholic Community from August 2024 to September 2025. It highlights our spiritual journey, community engagement, cultural celebrations, and continued alignment with the Ethnic Chaplaincy guidelines under the Auckland Archdiocese.

1. Visitations & Pastoral Care

As a community, we remain deeply considerate of our members during times of loss and celebration. This year, we have extended our pastoral care through visitations to members who have lost loved ones, offering prayers, emotional support, and a presence of solidarity in their grief. Similarly, we've celebrated the births of new children in our community with special visitations, prayers, and blessings for newborns and their families.

2. Sports Events & Community Engagement

Our community continues to encourage active participation in sports, fostering unity and friendship. The various sporting events have allowed members to come together in a spirit of teamwork and camaraderie. These events not only promote physical well-being but also strengthen the bonds within our community.

3. Community Singing at Parishes

We had the privilege of participating in community singing at two parishes: Holy Cross Parish and St. Paul's Massey. These events have allowed us to contribute to the spiritual atmosphere of the masses, bringing together both the younger and older generations to celebrate our faith through music.

4. Alignment with Ethnic Chaplaincy Guidelines

In line with our commitment to the broader Auckland Catholic community, the Fijian Catholic community has aligned itself with the Ethnic Chaplaincy guidelines. A key development this year was the transition of our financial accounts under the Auckland Archdiocese, ensuring greater transparency and accountability in our operations.

5. Cultural Celebrations

We continue to be an active presence in the wider cultural celebrations, both religious and national. Notable events included:

- Fiji Day: A celebration of Fijian culture, heritage, and identity.
- Diwali: A festive occasion shared with the Indian Community, fostering interfaith understanding. We have rebranded the Event as being “Christ is our Light”.
- Christian Religious Festivals: Participation in Christmas and Easter services, along with other religious observances, allowed us to reinforce our faith while embracing cultural diversity.

6. West Divine Mercy Silver Jubilee

Last year marked the Silver Jubilee of the West Divine Mercy Prayer Group, celebrating 25 years of spiritual devotion and community service. We now look forward to our 26th year, continuing our journey of prayer, outreach, and spiritual growth.

7. Christmas Eve & Easter Vigil Singing

Our choir had the honour of singing during the Christmas Eve Mass and Easter Vigil services at Holy cross Parish. These moments of worship provided a beautiful opportunity for the community to reflect on the birth and resurrection of Jesus Christ through the gift of music.

8. Election of New Leadership Group

At this year’s AGM, a new leadership group was elected, bringing fresh ideas and perspectives to guide the community forward. The election process was carried out in accordance with the guidelines, ensuring transparency and inclusivity.

9. Evolving Ex-Student Groups

The community has also seen the formation of evolving groups of Ex-Students from Fiji Catholic Schools, particularly from Marist Brothers High School and St. Thomas High School. These alumni groups come together once a year to participate in religious and cultural activities, contributing to the spiritual and cultural fabric of our community.

10. Regular Spiritual Activities

Our group continues to be deeply committed to our spiritual life. The following events remain staples in our calendar:

- Novena & Rosary: Held every fortnight, these prayer sessions provide an opportunity for personal reflection and communal prayer.
- Mass: Regular Sunday Mass services continue to foster spiritual nourishment and fellowship within the community.

11. Recent Sacramental Celebrations

The past year we have had few changes in our community with people leaving and people joining but we have been determined to continue our fellowship and support of the parish. Our youth are doing an amazing job at volunteering for both the parish and our chaplaincy, in roles and work. We do not have many Sunday school children this year, but the few that we do have are currently in the Sunday school every Sunday.

Our choir has had to make a few changes this year, and we are thankful that one of our community members and his family stepped up and helped with our choir, with the help of Les for our monthly holy cross music for Mass.

Holy Cross Catholic School Report to Parish AGM 2025

2025 has seen our school roll maintain the high numbers from 2024, and we expect to finish the year with approximately 470 students by the end of Term 4. We have had to open six Year 1 classes this year. Five of these are currently in the hall, and the sixth will open next term in the old classroom beside the new build.

The hall was beautifully refurbished by the Catholic Diocese of Auckland and has provided a pleasant, calm learning environment for the five teachers and 85 children based there. We sincerely thank the Parish for agreeing to allow the school to use the hall during the building of the first new block. The build is currently running to schedule, and we expect to move in around late February. Our second new build—the block across the front of the school—is due to come down in March.

Teachers have been very busy implementing the new Literacy and Mathematics Curriculum, and our students have continued to make pleasing progress.

On our School Board, we have renewed the four Bishop's Representatives, who are required to be members of the Parish. Bishop Steve approved the appointment of Father Ephrem, Bing de Jesus, and Danielle Lesatele (a past pupil and now a parent in the school), along with the reappointment of Peter Turnwald for a second term. We also held an election for three parent representatives. At the time of writing, the results of this election were not yet known.

This year we have continued to hold class Liturgies in classrooms, and these have been most successful. All students, from five-year-olds to twelve-year-olds, have the opportunity to take an active role in the Liturgy, and parent attendance has been outstanding. We have also continued to celebrate whole-school Masses in the Church, led by Father Ephrem.

We are grateful for the strong relationship we share with the Parish and welcome any suggestions on how we might further strengthen this special partnership. We are particularly excited to have Father Ephrem join our Board, helping to deepen the bond between Parish and School.

Holy Cross Caring Community continues to quietly cater for some of the social needs of the Senior Parishioners.

DROP IN is held in the Pastoral Centre each Tuesday morning following the 9.00am mass. This morning tea is well attended with an average of 30-50 people attending. This commences on the first Tuesday of February and continues until the last Tuesday of November. Thank you to all the Caring team who generously give their time in making everyone welcome.

THE SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING: This is held on the 3rd Tuesday of the month and is followed by a shared luncheon in the Pastoral Centre. This is also well attended averaging 40-50 people though less in the winter months. Thank you to our Friars who come and give us this very special anointing.

FUNERALS: We continue to cater for these if requested for Parish members. Due to the hall not being available for use we have only been able to cater for small funerals 50 people or less. These are held in the Pastoral Centre. This year we catered for funerals of Jack Beresdord and Neville Boyle.

WESTERN DEANERY: Morning tea and lunch for the Friars and Priests in the Western Deanery. 11-15 catered for.

We are involved in the First Holy Communion/Confirmation, Faith Sharing Sunday, Secular Franciscans, Wednesday evening bread run with SVDP, Parish Food Fair, Feast Days, Friars and Parishioners birthdays, Anniversaries and any other Parish functions we are asked to help.

We hold 2 raffles during the year Easter and Christmas. All funds raised are put back into the Parish. The kitchen appliances in our Pastoral Centre were all bought from funds raised by our Caring Committee. Dishwasher, stove, pie warmer, air fryer, fridge and vacuum cleaners, tablecloths tea towels and many other things.

We cater for two Senior's luncheon during the year. Due to the school using our hall being out of use we have had to put these events on hold. We are in the process of planning our Senior's Christmas Luncheon for this year in the Pastoral Centre These events are well attended 90 – 100 people. We involve our Holy Cross pupils at these events.

Our thanks go to the Friars, the Parish staff, Holy Cross School, our wonderful committee, helpers, dish washers and bakers. Without you we would not be able to serve our Parish. We continue to be on the lookout for those who are willing to volunteer time in assisting us to serve our parish.



HOLY CROSS FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE






